


Dr. Baldwin, a Lancaster County native who was featured on ABC's "The Bachelor," is riding his bicycle from Pittsburgh to Philadelphia this week and stopping at schools along the way to share about the importance of healthy eating and active living. He challenged the students to eat nutritious foods and get one hour of physical activity each day.

As part of the event, Fayetteville Fire Co. donated two boys' bikes and two girls' bikes to the school, which will be used as prizes in an upcoming Read to Ride competition. Students in Adam Whisel's business law class at CASHS were treated to a guest speaker from the Franklin County Courthouse last week: Judge Carol Van Horn, who serves as a judge for the 39th judicial district in Franklin and Fulton counties. Judge Van Horn shared about how the court system is structured and what kinds of cases she hears. She also emphasized the importance of judges being held to a high ethical standard.

Several students told Van Horn they're interested in pursing a career as an attorney, and she encouraged them to keep academics in the forefront to be prepared for law school. She also encouraged the entire class to visit the courthouse and watch the legal system in action.

CASHS Construction Update



The new gym has a few things we're trying to improve or fix, including one of the baskets and higher grade and stronger bolts on the doors. The concession stands have pizza warmers and hot dog warmers. They will have a new ice machine shortly; and the trainers' ice machine has just arrived.

The new kitchen equipment arrives Wednesday, which means the cafeteria will be ready before summer. The Food Services Department will have time to set up the cafeteria for next fall.

Second floor cabinetry work is close to completion in the science wing, and the third floor cabinets go in afterward. Masonry and rough-ins are continuing in the new performing arts wing, and masonry, grade beams, and stud work are occurring in the admin wing. The steel for the admin wing and library/pupil services wing will be on site in early November.


